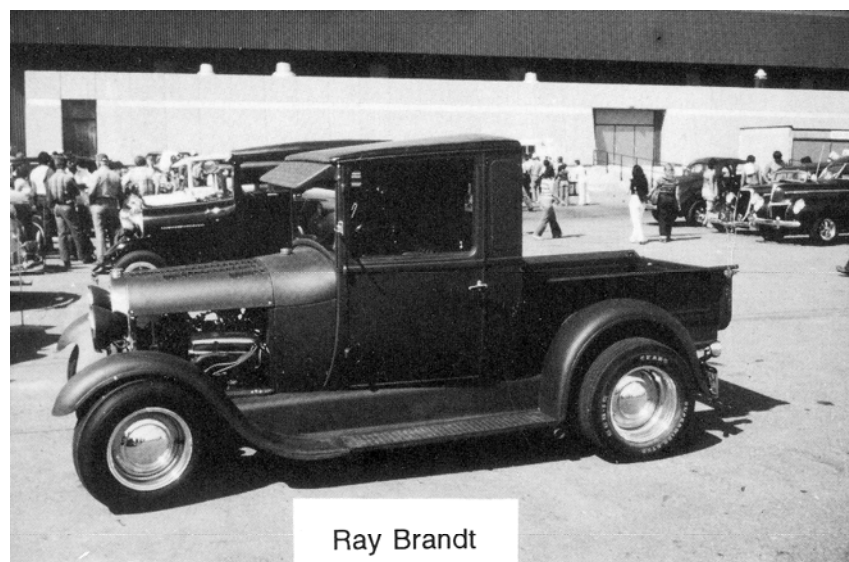


The club had spent two years promoting the Nationals in Regina - The first time west of Winnipeg. Our advertising talked about the fresh clean air of the prairies.

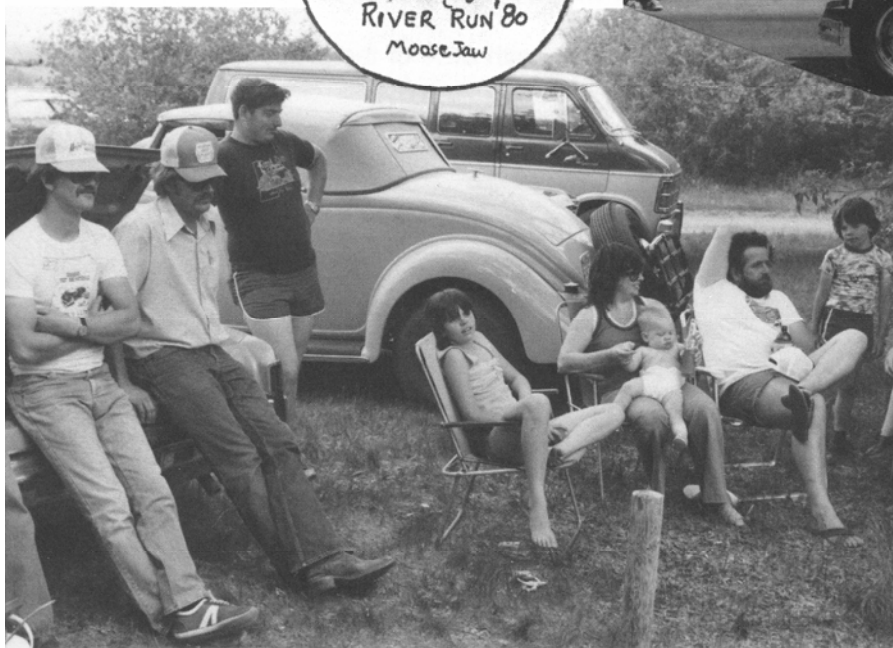

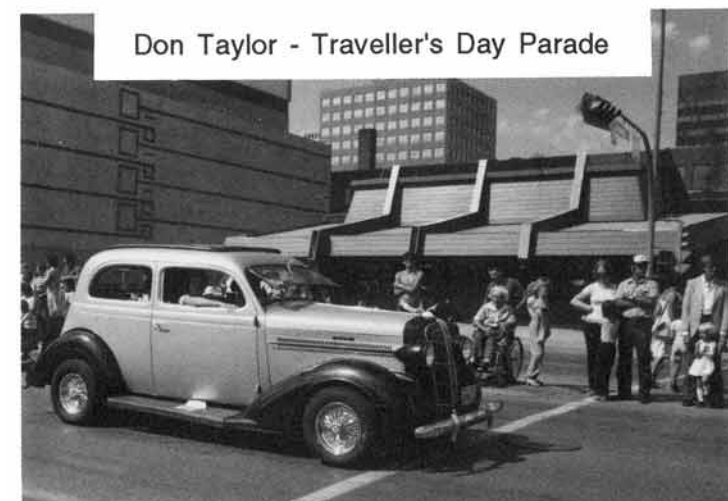

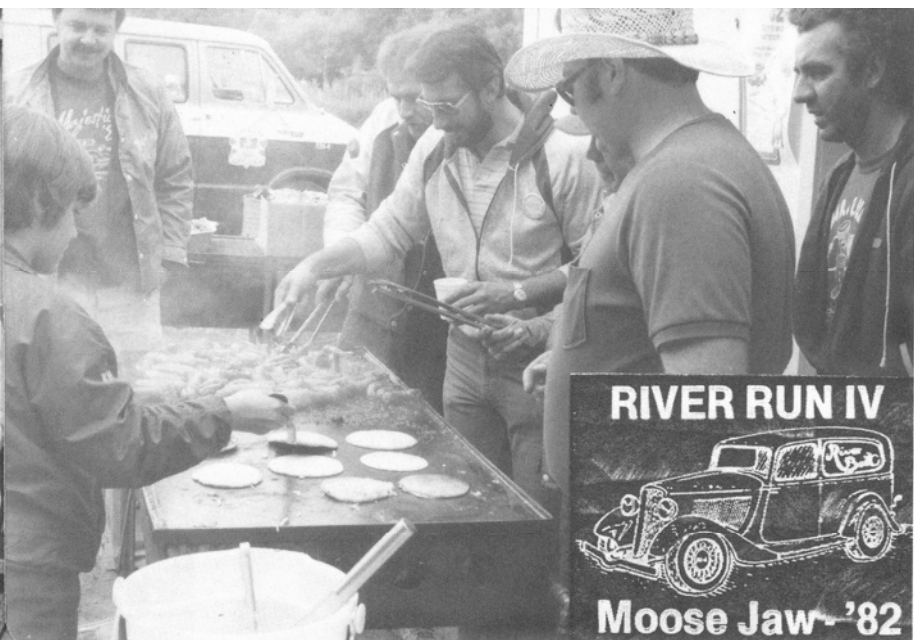

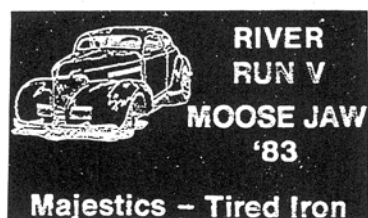

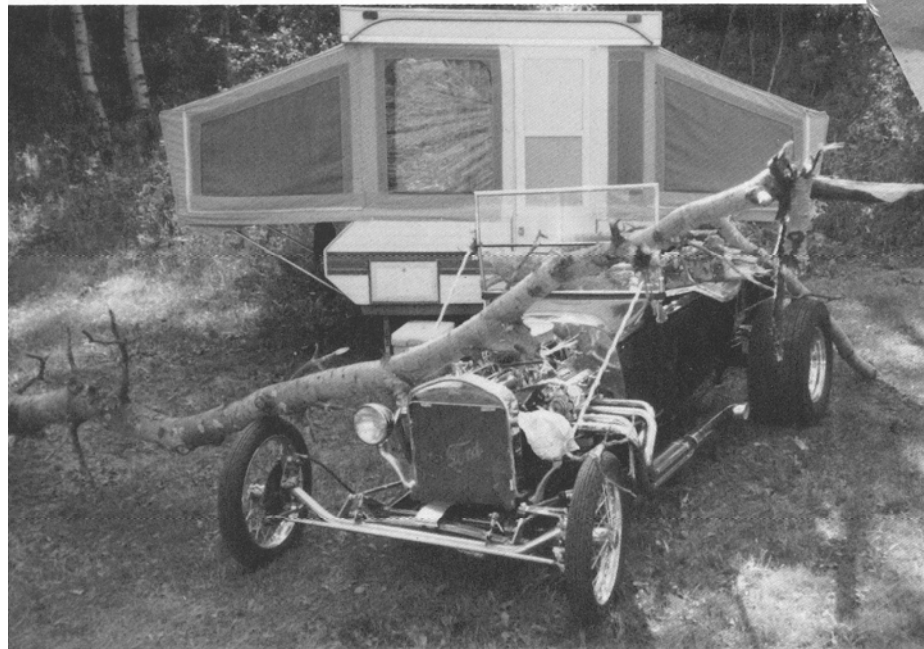

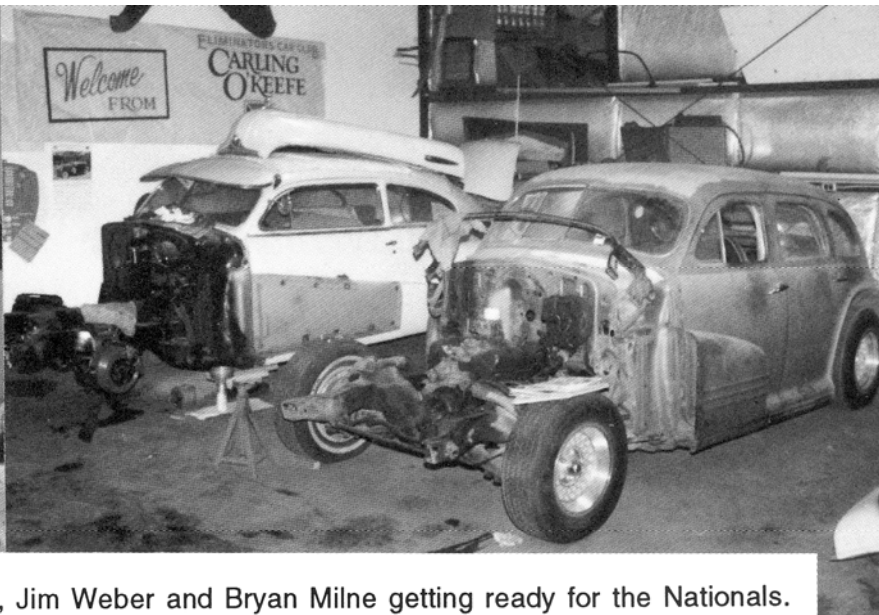
