






The PSRA of Regina hosted the Poker Run around the city which was won by James Beck of Saskatoon who had a perfect score.










#### "Beach Party"






Maurice Hall - 1939 Mercury 1989 "Vehicle of the Year" picture from cover of Sunday Sun advertising the 1989 Car Show.


